Exalting Man vs. Exalting God

The context of this warning is strong condemnation of the "lawyers and Pharisees" (by Jesus) whose leadership contradicted the word and heart of God and yet who insisted on preferential treatment and attention.

Jesus also called them... blind, foolish, hypocrites, snakes, sons of hell, etc. Wow!

Godly leaders should shun pretentious titles simply to ______ the _____ of importance, cleverness, or superiority. The issue is not a particular "word" (rabbi), but an implication of exalted ______ or _____ before God. We could steer clear of these particular words and make the same error using any other word. Avoiding ostentatious titles is simply a way of keeping everyone's head screwed on straight. Only GOD IS GREAT. Only GOD IS EXALTED.

Scripture tells us to ______ our leaders (government, church, family, etc.). (*Ex. 20:12, Rom. 12:10, 13:7, 1 Tim. 5:17, 1 Thess. 5:12-13, Heb. 13:17*). It is right and good to recognize someone's role, work, accomplishment, authority, responsibility, or example as important and impressive. This teaching balances that HONOR by adding HONESTY and HUMILITY.

Honesty > an important role does not make you a ______ important person (8)

Humility > a leadership role ______ the role of "servant."

To those folks who are easily impressed: Realize that appearances and presentation can be manufactured and manipulated to exaggerate itself, _______ of men. God is not impressed by title or showmanship. Regarding glory, God is a jealous God. (*Is. 42:8*)

To those folk who are never impressed: God has delegated authority to positions of leadership in many areas. Often those folks who fill these roles have great passion and vision and work hard to prepare and discharge their responsibility. God expects us to honor and support their leadership without constantly ______ or
