Biblical euphemism for DEATH

• <u>rest</u>

• <u>sleep</u>

SOUL SLEEP... teaching that there is no intermediate awareness between death and the future resurrection. We do not enter punishment or glory following death. The soul is simply asleep. Major doctrine of Adventist and Jehovah's Witness groups.

Orthodox Christianity has never accepted SOUL SLEEP as the Bible's teaching

Separation of <u>body</u> and <u>soul</u> [upon death]

Soul immediately in <u>God's presence</u>

Do the spirits/souls in heaven have some sort of (interim) body?

 The Bible does not give us <u>details</u>, but the <u>implication</u> is YES... a spiritual body.

Are folks up there watching us down here?

 The Bible <u>never</u> says that souls in heaven <u>watch</u> life on earth. But there are suggestions of a vague knowledge of <u>God's</u> work of <u>salvation</u> upon the earth. Will suicide, dementia, mental illness, etc. disqualify someone for heaven?

✓ <u>dementia</u> (L) > de [away from] + mens [mind]

* Demented is <u>not</u> a linguistic derivative of demon

God looks upon our "heart" and therefore <u>ignores</u> EXCUSES while <u>understanding</u> CIRCUMSTANCES and LIMITATIONS. His judgments <u>minimize</u> behavior and <u>maximize</u> motive.

"For God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything." (1 Jn. 3:20)

The Lord <u>considers</u> [physical/mental] limitations with absolute <u>compassion</u> and <u>understanding</u>.

"He KNOWS our frame [formation] and remembers that we are dust." (Ps. 103:13)

God will no more withdraw salvation from a believer because of a <u>mental</u> deficiency than because of a <u>physical</u> disability

"Though outwardly we are wasting away, inwardly we are being renewed..." (11 Cor. 4:16)
