What's With Forty?

Most of the numbers in the Bible are simply random. Some are related. Some are symbolic. And some are significant yet (frustratingly!) their significance is not explained.

These numbers are often significant in the Bible. 3, 7, 12, and 40

God apparently chose to make 40 significant when he assigned a YEAR in the wilderness for each DAY the Israelite spies had spent in Canaan. They had observed great possibilities and great risks. Everyone then had the opportunity to choose fear or faith.

Your children will be shepherds here for 40 years, suffering for your unfaithfulness, until the last of your bodies lies in the desert. For 40 years - one year for each of the 40 days you explored the land you will suffer for your sins and know what it is like to have me against you! (Num. 14:34)

FunFacts

In medieval times the port of <u>Venice</u> required foreign ships to sit at anchor 40 days before unloading. Hopefully any diseases on board would die off during this time.

Italian word for 40 = quarantina English = quarantine

40 DAYS AND 40 NIGHTS

Moses > intense trip back up on Mt. Horeb (Sinai) (Exodus 34)

Elijah > intense trip across desert to Mt. Horeb (1 Kings 19)

Jesus > intense retreat into isolation (Mt. 4, Mark 1, Luke 4)

Jesus <u>identified</u> his COMING with Elijah and his MISSION with Moses!

This period of time was quite intentional for Jesus. He wanted it to make a connection with the great law giver and the great prophet.

Part of the common experience was that God sustained their body and being while they intensely sought God's presence and God's will. Other issues dropped away during this time. Only after the 40 days did Jesus begin to feel hungry.

The MOST IMPORTANT NUMBER OF ALL! There is one body and one spirit, just as you were called to one hope. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. (Eph. 4:4-6)
