

\*"Spiritual" gifts are noted in Rom. 12:6-8, I Cor. 12:4-11, Eph: 11-12, I Peter 4:10-11

The short time period of Jesus, God's incarnation, was unique in human history. As prophesied, it accomplished a guilt offering for all mankind, demonstrated power over death (Is. 53:10-12), and witnessed the spectacular outpouring of God's Spirit upon [available for] all men (Joel 2:28-32).

During that time a small group of men who knew Christ personally demonstrated unusual abilities, such as speaking in unknown tongues (I Cor. 14:18) and healing sickness (Acts 19:11-12). These were men who had received the Spirit (Acts 20:22) and had been given authority over demons and diseases (Matt. 10:5-10).

These abilities were proof that the "Kingdom of Heaven is [really was!] near" (Matt 10:7). Additionally, some of these men recorded their experiences and convictions. God impressed them to do this and guided the process so that their words were God's Word (II Tim. 3:16). The death of these men was the end of an era that witnessed God's incarnation and revelation in Jesus (I John 1:1-3. Heb. 1:1-2).

#### Q: Are these abilities still needed/valid today? \*Was their purpose to glorify/demonstrate God OR to demonstrate the authority of the apostles as the true (and truthful) spokesmen for God?

**Continuation(ism) = YES.** These gifts are still needed and still given to people today.

**Cessation(ism) = NO.** Their purpose was to validate the apostolic message (gospel). That role is now to their writings. These gifts were given only for that unique era. Current given "manifestations" or claims are fakeries, counterfeit (Satanic) or simply delusions to be viewed with skepticism or denial.

wishful

- Controversy includes only "sign" gifts. No one argues over the spiritual gift of mercy or teaching. However, why would \_\_\_\_\_ and some \_\_\_\_\_ some gifts
- We are told to \_\_\_\_\_\_ these spiritual gifts (I Cor. 14:1-5) and not forbid them (14:39-40). If they seem bogus/disruptive, we are to "test' and "discern" (14:29, I Thess. 5:21, I John 4:1)
- The U.B. Church from inception has always believed in \_\_\_\_\_\_ of God's miracles as well as \_\_\_\_ in attributing every spectacular event to God. False prophets, fake healers, and emotional delusions exist today as they did in the NT era (Matt. 24:4-5, 11).
